Amos 6:1a, 4-7

Amen. ¹⁷As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. ¹⁸They are to do good, to be rich in good



At King of Glory we welcome all who believe Jesus Christ is present for and with us in the bread and wine.


