#### **NEIGHBORHOOD CONNECTION GROUPS**

Small town churches enjoy a sense of neighborliness large city churches sometimes lack. But not KOG! Although King of Glory members live throughout the metroplex, geographically clustered neighborhood cells offer a vehicle for members to connect with their King of

Glory neighbors. Neighborhood Connection Groups provide a way to get to know members of our faith community who live near to you, to enjoy one another's friendship and to pray and care for one another when needs arise.

YOU are already assigned a neighborhood and are represented by a leader who is there for you. Hosting in-person gatherings in our neighborhoods has been hindered by Covid precautions but your neighbors are still right there – willing to pray for you, to bring food during illness or help with transportation and other needs. Your leader is also a good person to call if you'd like someone to pray for you or if you'd like them to pass on a prayer need to the pastors for you.

### If You Build It, They Will Come!

You might have noticed that a few new plantings are coming along nicely on the slope outside of the Activity Center. KOG has recently dedicated this space as the spot for our new pollinator garden! Volunteers have spent a few workdays, over the past several months, getting the space into shape and kicking off the planting. The goal for this garden is to attract butterflies, bees and various other pollinators, as well as provide full butterfly habitats for several species. I took my family outside to look at the progress last Sunday and was very pleased to see that we are building it, and they are coming! That's right...our Orange Butterfly Weed is budding, AND we already have Monarch eggs!!! This begins the initial step in the life cycle of the first species to call our garden home, and hopefully we will get to see the entire process unfold. Orange Butterfly Weed and various other Milkweeds are the host plants for Monarch caterpillars. In case you weren't aware, God designed each species of butterfly to feed on very specific plants. A butterfly instinctively knows those plants on which to lay its eggs, so that the infant caterpillars will have immediate nourishment. As we follow this process, also keep in mind that Dallas is in the flyway for Monarch migration from September through the end of October, so watch for Monarchs in your neighborhood! Believe it or not, around 500,000 Monarchs migrate through Texas each vear!!!

What an honor it is for our congregation to play a part in providing nectar and plant nourishment for this crucial species and I encourage you to check out the pollinator garden when you are at church.

May we notice and appreciate God's majesty in the world around us!



Watch for any upcoming announcements on our next garden workday, which should be scheduled for late October or early November.
