# KOG Refugee Resettlement Ministry Welcome to Our Newest Family

THANK YOU to John Mathis, the Refugee Resettlement Team and all of you who donated to our newest family.

The Azzad family, Abdul, his wife Fouzia and their son Zain, are from the Hilmand Provence, an area that is now totally controlled by the Taliban. Abdul was acting as an interpreter/translator for the U.S. forces, the result of which made him an enemy of the Taliban. Knowing the danger that existed for him and his family, he aggressively took steps to get his approval for an SIV visa. This required that he drive from his home to Kabul (a trip of 300-350 miles) to complete the paperwork and interviews. This trip required that he pass through two Taliban checkpoints while hiding important papers in Fouzia's hijab (head covering), thinking it would be unlikely that they would search her.

They did get approval for the SIV visa, but getting the required travel approval was more problematic. Believing the danger was too great to wait for that approval, they found money to make the trip to the U.S. They have friends here in the DFW area which is why they decided on Dallas as their destination. Once here, with their worldly possessions in three suitcases, they contacted the RST office for help.

The family is quite delightful. Abdul is easy to talk to and his English is excellent. He has 14 years of education with an associate degree in IT. Fouzia speaks no English but has a beautiful smile. Their son, Zain, who is not quite ready to talk, acts as though he has never met anyone he didn't like. He was quickly friendly with me, taking my finger and directing me around the apartment. I'm not certain how much assistance this family will need from us, but I expect that any contact with them will be a joy.

Even though it was short notice, many of you jumped in and donated items, shopped, cleaned, and more all to welcome these strangers. Again, thank you to all who helped with this effort, whether through direct action or via prayer.
